Budget Bulletin 2018-19

Inclusive Economic Growth

Government is focused on building and promoting a more innovative and diverse economy — an economy where more doors are open for people who have faced barriers to employment and where the benefits of growth are shared with those who need it most.

Budget 2018-19 includes

Inclusive Growth

- \$1.7 million to expand the Graduate to Opportunity program, which includes a larger subsidy for hiring diverse graduates and women in non-traditional careers, bringing the total program investment to \$6.5 million
- \$1.7 million to continue to implement the Innovate to Opportunity program
- \$356,000 to create 89 additional student research internships through the Mitacs Accelerate program, for a total of \$1 million and 250 placements
- \$1.5 million to increase work incentives for people receiving income assistance
- \$460,000 increase to the Office of Immigration to help international marketing and recruitment efforts
- \$600,000 in permanent funding for immigrant settlement services to help new residents adapt to life in Nova Scotia



Sector Growth and Innovation

- Launching Research Nova Scotia to manage a multi-year fund to support research projects in key sectors
- \$500,000 more for incubators and accelerators, which support startup companies
- \$485,000 to create a market-readiness program to help startup companies
- \$2.5 million more to encourage private sector innovation and productivity projects through the Innovation Rebate program, for a total of \$5 million
- \$3 million investment in the Centre for Ocean Ventures Entrepreneurship (COVE) project to foster innovation in the ocean sector in partnership with the federal government
- \$3 million for the new Building Tomorrow Fund to support innovation in agriculture, fisheries, and aquaculture sectors
- \$5.8 million added to the province's contribution to the Atlantic Fisheries Fund, in partnership with the federal government and other Atlantic Canadian provinces
- \$657,000 to conduct geoscience work as part of the \$14 million, four-year Offshore Growth Strategy



- \$700,000 to create the Mineral Resources Development Fund to increase prospecting, mine development, and research
- \$10 million added to the Nova Scotia Film and Television Production Incentive Fund, for a total fund of \$20 million in 2018–19
- \$275,000 to make permanent the successful Business Navigators pilot program, which guides businesses through government regulations and compliance
- \$3 million contribution in the first year of a fouryear, federal-provincial initiative to deliver more low-carbon efficiency programs, while supporting jobs in local businesses
