The Department has broad responsibilities for the development, management, conservation and protection of energy, forests, geoscience, mines, minerals, parks, and wildlife resources, and the administration of the Province's Crown lands. Together we are working with Nova Scotians to build a better future through sustainable natural resource management for us all to benefit from the natural health and wealth of the province.

## What we are doing to contribute to the growth of the Acadian and francophone community

We recognize the importance of French-language services and we endeavour to fulfil our responsibilities under the *French-language Services Act* and regulations. Nova Scotians must have access to government services in French, and this plan demonstrates our commitment to ensuring our programs, policies and services address the priorities expressed by the Acadian and francophone community. To achieve this aim, we collaborate with other designated public institutions across government – including the Office of Acadian Affairs and Francophonie – through the French-language Services Coordinating Committee. These partnerships ensure a continued understanding of the unique needs of our province's Acadian and francophone community.

Natural Resources and Renewables continues to provide information in French that may be of interest to the province's Acadian and francophone communities. The Department's responsibilities for the stewardship of our natural resources help to support the economies of many Acadian and francophone communities. The Department considers input received from the Acadian and francophone community and its individual members during public participation activities as well as during the revision of departmental legislation.

We encourage Nova Scotians to request services from government in French. We also encourage Acadians and francophones to have their voices heard by participating on agencies, boards, and commissions, which are regularly advertised by the Executive Council Office. As we continue to maintain and improve our French-language services, we welcome feedback on our progress, and we invite you to share with us your comments or questions by contacting our French-language services coordinator.

#### How we communicate with the public in French

Natural Resources and Renewables supports continued compliance with the requirements of Nova Scotia's *French-language Services Act* and regulations that relate to communicating with the public. Natural Resources and Renewables aims to maximize transparency by providing services in French.

#### What we did to maintain or improve our French-language services in 2023–24 Objective 1: Strengthen internal operational structures including policy, legislative and administrative frameworks

- Department Goal: Raise staff awareness of departmental responsibilities and obligations with respect to French-language services
  - Measure: Information sessions for managers and directors on the requirements of the *French-language Service Act* and regulations, and opportunities for French-language training
    - No information sessions were held this fiscal. Findings from earlier discussions were used to inform next steps.
  - Measure: Information sessions for public-facing staff on requirements of the *French-language Service Act* and regulations, and opportunities for French-language training
    - No information sessions were held with public-facing staff.
    - Regional offices in areas with larger French-speaking populations have been identified to enable a targeted approach to capacity building.

#### **Objective 2: Develop and deliver quality French-language services and programs to the public**

- Department Goal: Improve existing French-language content on the department's website to facilitate access
  - Measure: News releases pertaining to public safety and other relevant documents made available in French

- 20 media releases pertaining to fire safety and historic Shelburne County and Halifax area wildfires. Coverage was fully bilingual with daily or twice daily updates when fires were most active.
- Bilingual signage about avian flu developed to support public safety.
- Department Goal: Maintain or increase enrollment in French-language training
  - Measure: Number of individual staff who received French-language training, and total aggregate enrollment (accounting for staff who attend multiple sessions)
    - Staff registered for a total of 11 French-language training courses in 2023-24 with three staff members attending multiple sessions.

#### **Objective 3: Maintain ongoing dialogue and consultation with the Acadian and francophone community**

- Department Goal: Ensure legislated requirements for consulting with the Acadian and francophone community are met during at least one session of every series of Province-wide public meetings conducted by Natural Resources and Renewables
  - Measure: Appropriate mechanisms for consultation used for departmental review of policy and legislation
    - One province-wide bilingual online consultation was held this fiscal year.
