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Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage 2023-24 Priority Actions in Support of Government's Business Plan

Introduction

The Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage (CCTH) includes the following divisions: Archives, Museums & Libraries; Communities, Sport & Recreation; Culture & Heritage Development; Office of Gaelic Affairs; Office of African Nova Scotian Affairs; Office of Acadian Affairs & Francophonie; Policy & Corporate Services; and Tourism Nova Scotia.

Collaborating with diverse and creative communities, the department works to integrate tourism, the arts, culture, heritage, language, recreation, and sport to create a more vibrant, equitable, inclusive, and sustainable Nova Scotia for residents and visitors. Our work supports three strategic goals: sector growth and recovery, ending systemic racism and creating a more equitable province, and creating healthy communities.

Priority Actions

Solutions for Healthcare: Supporting healthy living and celebrating diverse communities

Enable Infrastructure that Supports Culture & Communities

- Fund community infrastructure programs, including the Rink Revitalization Fund, Generator Fund, and the Community Facility Improvement Program.
- Implement the Let's Get Moving Strategy to promote physical activity, wellness, and healthy living.
- Work with the Accessibility Directorate to implement the 2022-25 Government of Nova Scotia Accessibility Plan, supporting communities, businesses, museums, archives, public libraries and Visitor Information Centres to develop and action accessibility plans.

Address the Social Determinants of Health

- Work with other Departments to address food insecurity by improving access to healthy foods, increasing food production, supporting economic development, and creating a more diverse and inclusive food system.
- Work with other Departments to address child poverty through actions that aim to reduce social isolation, reduce health disparities, support access to healthy food, address systemic discrimination and anti-Black racism, and improve quality of life.

Solutions for Economy: Growing the tourism, arts, culture, heritage, recreation, and sport sectors

Promote Assets, Cultivate Compelling Experiences, and Support the Tourism Industry

- Develop and implement a Tourism Sector Strategic Plan, a year-round tourism marketing strategy, an Integrated Airport Marketing Plan, African Nova Scotian Cultural Tourism Strategy and support Mi'kmaw cultural tourism.
- Support continued recovery within the tourism sector, grow regional tourism and foster a competitive and resilient tourism industry.
- Establish a Nova Scotia film marketing framework that leverages work in the film industry and can enhance Nova Scotia's tourism reputation and support the attraction of tourists.

Invest in the Creative Economy & Artistic Excellence

- Work with the sector to explore opportunities to strengthen strategic culture export development and domestic activities
- Develop a community asset map that identifies cultural tourism assets at the region/community level, including libraries and museums.
- Invest in arts and culture organizations, community museums, and Nova Scotia Museums to support sector sustainability.
- Amplify current events and support event attraction and development across Nova Scotia.

Solutions for our Future: Creating vibrant, equitable, inclusive, and sustainable communities

Support Community Assets that Contribute to Community Well-being

- Implement the Department's Climate Adaptation Strategy.
- Develop new museum exhibits that celebrate Nova Scotia's diverse cultures and communities.
- Promote Gaelic's value and contribution through innovative language and culture programs.
- Develop approaches to increase awareness of Acadian and Francophone culture and heritage; promote the growth of Nova Scotia's Francophone population, and work with other departments and community to plan for the Congrès Mondial Acadien in August 2024.
- Collaborate with the sector to implement the Voluntary Sector Roadmap to support sustainability.
- Lead safe sport efforts to ensure physical, social and emotional welfare of everyone involved in sport.

Address Systemic Racism and Inequities

- Work with the Office of L'nu Affairs to support implementation of the Mi'kmaw Language Act.
- Create and promote an integrated approach within government on matters related to the growth and well-being of African Nova Scotian communities; support cultural organizations and increase awareness of African Nova Scotian culture, heritage, and community issues; and celebrate and commemorate African Nova Scotians.
- Implement anti-racism initiatives and actions outlined in Count Us In: Nova Scotia's Action Plan in Response to the International Decade for People of African Descent.
- Improve program service delivery by creating a more simplified and consistent approach to grants administration and understand the impact of our investments through evaluation.
